Greetings to the many Nehrenz family members and friends all across the U.S.A.!

This newsletter will introduce you to the family of <u>Carl Nehrenz</u>, the third oldest son of Johann Christian Nehrenz. The original Nehrenz people came from Trollenhagen, Germany in November 1869. They landed at the Battery Park Castle Garden on Manhattan Island in New York City on the ship "Borussia" and then went on to Cleveland, Ohio. However, **Carl** and Frederick Nehrenz came to the U.S.A. and Cleveland two years later in 1871 on the ship "Barends."

Carl was the third oldest son, and he was the only one to live his life and raise his family mostly in Wisconsin. The only living descendant of his family was Lucy Polodna Nehrenz, wife of Percy Nehrenz. She lived to be 104 years old and she recently died on September 15th, 2009. I had several long phone conversations with her and she was an energetic and fun-loving person! With her death, there are no more living descendants from the Carl Nehrenz line.

What is interesting about Carl, the third oldest, and Frederick, the first oldest, is that since they did not come to the U.S.A. until 1871, they had probably stayed behind for two years to take care of the Nehrenz family property in Trollenhagen. It would be interesting to be able to locate the exact place where the Nehrenz family lived in 1869. Possibly with future research of the local records in Germany, that could be done.

Carl was a laborer who worked in a factory and was a member of St. John's Lutheran Church in Madison, Wisconsin. All of his other siblings lived in Ohio, and for some reason he moved to Wisconsin by 1878. My grandfather, Dr. John Nehrenz, who was a dentist in Cleveland, Ohio, attended his Uncle Carl's funeral in 1913, so the Ohio and Wisconsin Nehrenzs did keep in touch. Carl's family only has three generations of descendants. Enjoy reading about the "Wisconsin Nehrenzs."

<u>Notes</u> for **"CARL"** JOHANN CARL FRIEDRICK THEODOR NEHRENZ: Carl came over with Frederick (who was the eldest son and was already married in Trollenhagen when he came over with his wife) in November 1871, two years after the rest of the family did in 1869. He was also known as "Charles"

<u>By 1878</u>, his 2nd oldest, his daughter **Carolyn**, was born in Wisconsin, and we are not sure where his oldest son Frank Nehrenz was born in about 1876-77, so we know for sure that by 1878 he was living in Wisconsin and no longer in Ohio.

In 1888, at the death of his father, the death listing in Immanuel

Lutheran Church in Cleveland, OH indicates that Johann Christian Nehrenz was survived by his wife Maria and only 6 children, though he had 7 children. It seems that Carl-Charles had been gone long enough in Wisconsin (over 10 years) so that the pastor who wrote the death notice for his father did not even know the whereabouts of the 7th child or assumed he was dead?

Carl Nehrenz had already moved to Madison, WI. and was a member at St. John's Lutheran Church 322 East Washington Ave. Madison, Wisconsin 53703 (phone 608-256-2337) and raised his whole family there. This information comes from **Mrs. Lucy** (**Percy's wife- Percy is Carl's son) Nehrenz** in a letter to David Nehrenz. Carl worked in the factory in Wisconsin and developed a serious problem with his lungs from that work and died from that lung condition.

Note: At 1334 Williamson St, two doors down is a Herman Schmelzkopf family, by 1900 Carl's daughter Carolyn is out of their house, married in 1899 to Edward Carl Schmelzkopf. Also their son **Frank** is 25 years old not living with them. They also have a Mary Larkins, widow age 64 and her son William age 24 living at their house.

From Lucy Nehrenz: Minnie Nehrenz, the wife of Carl Nehrenz was a very nice person and a good cook. Later in life she fell, broke her hip and died in old age with the injury. Her husband Carl worked in the factory in Wisconsin and developed a serious problem with his lungs from that work and died from that lung condition.

Minnie Nehrenz and her husband Carl owned a home with two stories, they lived in one half and rented out the other half. After Carl died, she lived there, and when she was older, she fell and was injured and broke her hip and then went to live with her daughter Carolyn until she died. When she fell and moved out of the 2 story house, Percy and Lucy moved into it.

From Lucy Nehrenz:

Percy's oldest brother Frank Nehrenz, as a young man, went out looking for work and probably rode the trains. He disappeared in 1911 and was never heard from again, and the family assumed he was in an accident of some kind, perhaps on the rail lines.

When his father Carl Nehrenz was dying, he was asking about his eldest son Frank and no one could answer his questions to his satisfaction.

Lucy never saw a picture of Frank and does not know anything about him.

Rothermel Fund

Mr. William A. Rothermel, a Wisconsin resident, had a B.S. in Agronomy and a M.S. in Soil Science. He had a very successful professional career working for 40 years in agriculture-related areas of Merck Pharmaceuticals. He and his wife Audrey felt strongly about the need for having a high quality university agronomy education program available for Wisconsin students. They became well acquainted with Dr. Steve Carlson and the Agronomy Program at UW-River Falls. In 1995 they established the William A. and Audrey W. Rothermel Professorship in Agronomy through the UW-River Falls Foundation to support agronomic education and activities at the university. At the same time a scholarship fund also was jointly established by the Rothermels and Merck. These made up the largest single bequest ever received up to that time by the Foundation. A percentage of the annual interest earned by the Professorship grant funds is made available each year for support of agronomic activities. This has made it possible to support student and faculty travel to meetings and activities and acquire some needed laboratory and classroom equipment that otherwise would not be possible. It also has allowed significant Plant & Earth Science Department funds not now used by agronomy to be utilized by other disciplines in the department.



This was the 1900 census in Madison, WI. where Carl is listed with his wife Willimina and their sons Edmund and Percy. He is 51, she is 41, Edmund is 18 and Percy 4. They had been married 25 years. They had 4 children, but the older son Frank and daughter Carolyn are already out of the house by 1900. In 2012 the 1940 census will be released. The National Archives waits 72 years before it releases the census records.



This was the Castle Garden Clinton Immigration center in the 1870s on the tip of Manhattan Island in NYC. This is where the ships landed on which the Nehrenzs came to America. This location is just down the street from where the Twin Towers used to stand.
