Hello to the Nehrenz family members and friends! The last issue of this newsletter was in November 2013 and the topic was “Did you know that...? The purpose was to share interesting stories and anecdotes about various Nehrenz people since 1869, when they came to America. **Many of them could be called “Nehrenz In-Laws!”**

In 17 years of these newsletters, I realized we had never done an issue solely dedicated to all the men and women who are connected to the Nehrenz family surname, but who for several generations have not carried on the actual Nehrenz name. **I guess you could say they would be called the “Nehrenz Out-Laws!”** When we have our own Nehrenz Reunion in Ohio once every two years, we take a photo of all of our “Nehrenz Out-Laws” who have married Nehrenz guys and gals.

I will try to list and describe in this newsletter **the many other surnames** which are connected to the Nehrenz surname. This will be a long list. Every man or woman who was born with the Nehrenz name and then was married, has brought **another surname into the mix** through the spouse. Also, as their children with different surnames marry people with additional surnames, the Nehrenz surname is lost in some families within one or two generations. After nearly 200 years, the various surnames have begun to multiply exponentially and it is a difficult task to track them.

However, over the years, I have discovered that some of those who are most interested in the Nehrenz History are those who do not actually have that last name themselves. **A family tree has many branches and we are shaped by all of them.**

So here we go. I know we will probably overlook some important surnames, but if we do, please contact us so we can include your family and families. As I do in every issue, the front page of this newsletter lists **the original ancestors** of us all. It is a good idea to refer back to it often, so as to avoid endless confusion about who is related to whom.

I hope you enjoy this issue, whether you are a Nehrenz “In-law” or “Out-law!”

The William Nehrenz family, which includes the Fritz, Ernst and Brobst families in Cleveland, Ohio



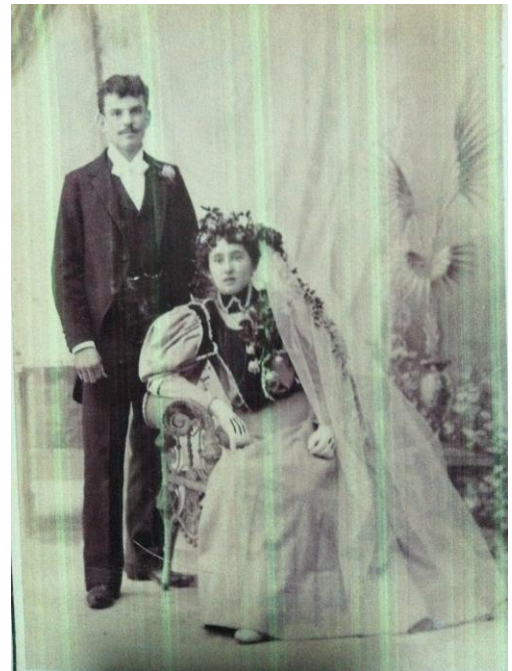

The 164-average bowler fired 13 consecutive strikes in the Women Golfers' League at Linsz Recreation last night but failed to achieve a 300 game. She wound up an opening 236 with eight straight strikes and then cleaned the slides five more times in 216 game before missing. A final 170 game gave her a 622 series.

However, she missed tying for the lead in the women's division of the Plain Dealer contest by one pin as Aleda Graebner rolled 237 in the Linsz Ladies Industrial League to take the top position.

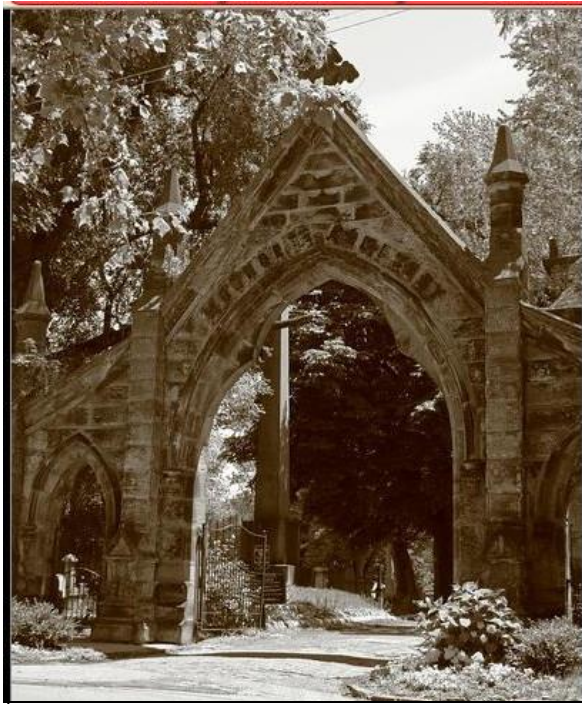

He was a Lutheran school teacher, musician, organist and professor of music at Concordia College, River Forest Illinois. He wrote the books "God & Man in Music," "The Practice of Sacred Music," "The Christian Choir Member," "A Handbook of Church Music." He served as Interim President of the college.



St. Paul's Lutheran Church, Lakewood, OH. Many of the Nehrenz, Halter, and Rupprecht families were members here. The church, sadly, was torn down, it was right near Lakewood Public Library,





The Monroe Street Cemetery in Cleveland, Ohio. Many of the family members of Christian Nehrenz and his wife Freiderika Bahlke are buried there. Their descendants included the Schnur, Fraundorf, Malloy, Schaloske families.

His parents were Carl Fraundorf and Ruth Schnur, his grandparents were John Schnur and Louise Nehrenz, his great-grandparents were Christian Nehrenz and Freiderika Bahlke. He was assigned to the 804th Tank Destroyer Battalion in W.W. II in 1943. They would play a significant role in the Rome-Arno, North Apennines and Po Valley Campaigns. He worked as a bricklayer and later a millwright for General Motors. He lived in Parma, OH.

Bertha Nehrenz, daughter of Christian Nehrenz and Freiderika Bahlke, was married to John Edward Schaloske. Her son Walter Schaloske was married to Florence Marian Mellott. She had a career as a Registered Nurse and worked at Mansfield General Hospital in Ohio.



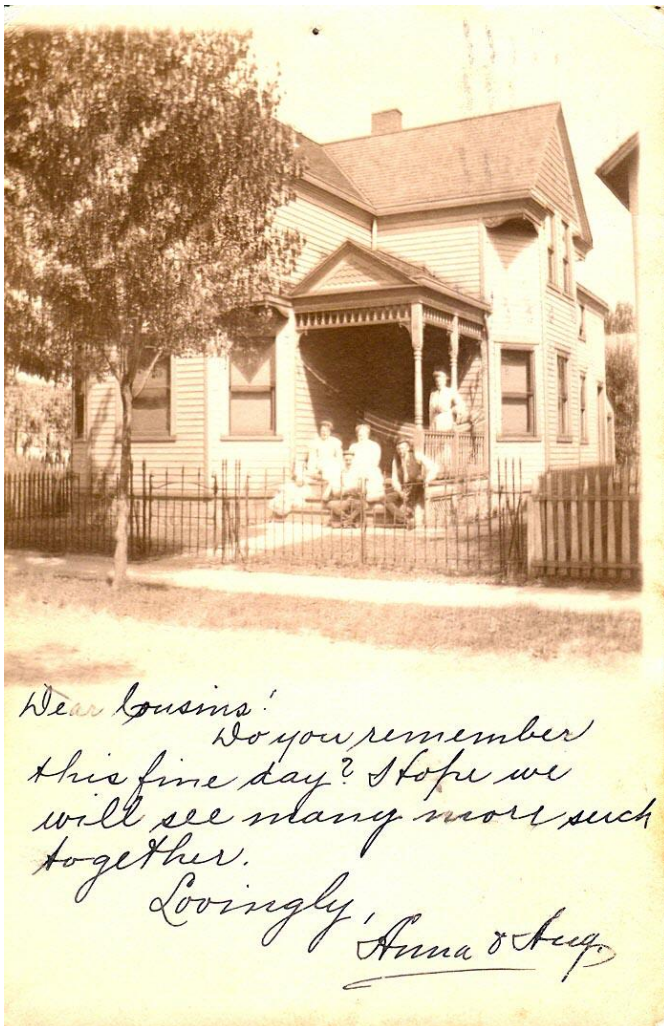

They were the same age and grew up together at Trinity and Immanuel Lutheran Churches in Cleveland. August was married to Anna K. Tobaben and he was a teacher, choir director and organist at Lutheran churches in New York. All four of them are sitting on the front porch in a photo that had been made into a postcard.



Franklin E. Martens was married to Evelyn M. Horn from 1929-1941 and to Dora Jane Kamps from 1942-1992, the year she died. He was the son of Frank Martens and Kate Lemke and the grandson of Herman Martens and Minnie Nehrenz.

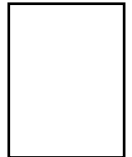
